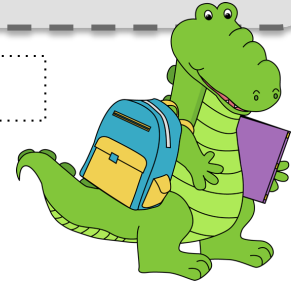


Use an apostrophe (') with a noun to show possession or ownership.
