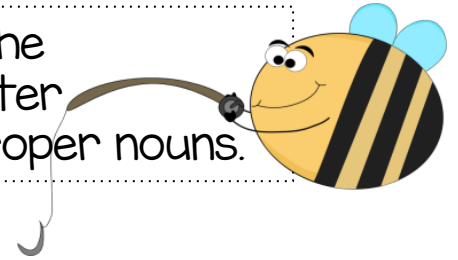


An adverb tells more about a verb. Some tell **how**, **when**, or **where** about the verb.
